CORE COURSES – MAJORS

NOTE: The four required, core courses in the Children's Studies Program (AP/HUMA 1970 6.0, 2690 6.0, 3695 6.0, and 4142 6.0) MUST be taken one at a time and in order. Students who enrol in more than one of these courses at the same time will be required to withdraw from all but the lowest of these courses not completed.

To complete your upper level requirements (3000- and 4000-level courses), you may choose additional courses from the various relevant 3000- and 4000-level offerings available throughout the University.

Intensive advising (group and individual) will be provided both to majors and minors in the Children's Studies Program to assist you in fulfilling the program requirements. Whenever possible, Children's Studies academic advisors will warn you of the prerequisites you must have to take the upper-level offerings in which you express interest. For instance, all upper-level Psychology courses require at least 1000-level Psychology and sometimes other courses.

With the approval of the Program Coordinator, you may complete other courses for credit in Children's Studies. Subject to course exclusion and in-Faculty regulations, you may also complete courses offered outside of the Faculty of Liberal Arts & Professional Studies for credit in Children's Studies. It is also possible for students to take a course at another Canadian University or as part of an international exchange program. In such instances, you are advised to obtain prior course approval from the Program Coordinator.
