To complete your upper level requirements (3000- and 4000-level courses), you may choose additional courses from the various relevant 3000- and 4000-level offerings available throughout the University, including, possibly, Directed Reading courses in various units. Intensive advising (group and individual) will be provided both to majors and minors in the *Children's Studies Program* to assist you in fulfilling the program requirements. Whenever possible, *Children's Studies* academic advisors will warn you of the prerequisites you must have to take the upper-level offerings in which you express interest. For instance, all upper-level Psychology courses require at least 1000-level Psychology and sometimes other courses.

With the approval of the Program Coordinator, you may complete other courses for credit in *Children's Studies*. Subject to course exclusion and in-Faculty regulations, you may also complete courses offered outside of the Faculty of Liberal Arts & Professional Studies for credit in *Children's Studies*. It is also possible for students to take a course at another Canadian University or as part of an international exchange program. In such instances, you are advised to obtain prior course approval from the Program Coordinator.
